

## Tatler's 101 best hotels



## Chhatra Sagar

The setting is spectacular - 11 tents pitched on a dam with a view of the lake below and the rich green farmland beyond - and the food is the best in Rajasthan. Chhatra Sagar is run by two brothers, one of whom will show you around the local farms, silver shops and village temples; the other will suggest you amble up the hill to watch the spectacular sunset but neglect to mention (bliss!) that a fully stocked bar will greet you at the top. Watch the pelicans, cranes and antelopes gather at the lake in the middle of an otherwise hectic trip (you're two hours from Jodhpur) and exhale. ## Gran Hotel Son Net

Puigpunvent, Majorca

Son Net faces south, so even in March you can sit on the terrace and be bathed in sunshine. It's a short hop from Palma, surrounded by pine forests and hills of wild gladioli, daisies and poppies. The land was once, supposedly, owned by a pirate; the house built on it, dating back to the 17th century, is stunning, with open fires and brilliant bathrooms. It feels like a family home. ## Riad Farnatchi

Marrakesh, Morocco

A luxurious, utterly cocooning bolthole, Riad Farnatchi is a five-suite baby-hotel that's far less pretentious – and has far better service – than other upstarts we could mention. It's smart, pretty and all about comfort, with the added bonus of 24-hour room service, a revolution

in the riad. Order Moët and ice-cream with caramel sauce at 3am and no one bats an eyelid. Personal attention is high on the agenda. Manager Lynn Perez has been known to 'entice' policemen into letting guests ride camels into the Djemaa el Fna (normally forbidden) before dismounting to sip cocktails. Then everyone returns home for frenetic

dancing till dawn. When the hangover kicks in, Lynn will give the yoga teacher a bell. Or you can retreat to the hammam for a jasmine massage.
